Infrastructure Security Subcommittee – Capt Jay Hagan, 206.733.9465

Reviews and develops policies to improve region-wide land-based and waterside infrastructure security and physical security. Serves as a communications link for resources and response regarding the security and resiliency of the maritime infrastructure within the region. Serves as a nexus between port stakeholders, the AMSC, FMSC and other AMSC Subcommittees to vet and resolve infrastructure issues, prioritize assets, and address coordination concerns.

Serves as a communications link for Law Enforcement resources and creates agreements for information sharing and tracking on all harbor-related issues using the Joint Harbor Operations Center (JHOC) as a nexus and future platform for analysis. At a minimum, the following agencies should be active participants: ICE, USCG, CGIS, Washington State Patrol, FBI, CBP, NCIS, Seattle Police, Port of Seattle Police, King County Sheriff, Pierce County Sheriff and may include Washington State Department of Corrections (DOC).

Serves as a nexus between port stakeholders, the AMSC, FMSC, and other AMSC Subcommittees to vet new technology and resolve issues related to information sharing or management.
