Please share the following with the AAFA Board and Membership as it recounts items of interest that arose during the month of February and looks forward to certain events occurring in upcoming months.

Follow-up on January’s upcoming events that occurred during February:

1. February 13 - Webinar for US stakeholders to present and solicit input on the results of the initial North Pacific albacore MSE. This lengthy webinar was not very helpful. It was far too technical and industry representatives on the call expressed extreme disappointment. Note – given the lack of clarity, a follow-up call was held on February 28 in an attempt to offer some additional clarity.

Federal Register Items of Interest:

In past reports we have highlighted actions taken against Canadian importers and industry by the International Trade Administration of the Department of Commerce and The United States International Trade Commission. The intent was to show how there are some tensions between the two Nations on certain trade issues. Upcoming Items of interest on next page

Upcoming items of interest – this is not an exhaustive list; but shows those upcoming events which could impact the albacore fishery.

1. March 5 – 7 – MSE Workshop in Yokohama, Japan.
2. March 5 – 12 – PFMC meeting in Vancouver, Wa. There are items on the Agenda which may impact the Albacore fishery.
 - a. There is an item on Fishing Effort within the albacore fishery – see https://www.pcouncil.org/wp-content/uploads/2019/02/J2_Att2_Summary-of-US-NPALB-fishing-effort-estimates-MAR2019BB.pdf;
 - b. There is another item, more informational in nature, focused on the ongoing efforts to develop a Management Strategy Evaluation for North Pacific albacore. 3. April 9 – 16 - PFMC meeting in Rohnert Park, Ca. There aren’t typically HMS items on the April meeting; but will confirm as that meeting approaches.
4. May 20 -23 – 70th Annual Tuna Conference in Lake Arrowhead, Ca. This year’s topic is Data collection: emerging tools that address fundamental challenges in the research and management of large pelagic species. Unlike the last few years, which seemed to be primarily focused on Pacific bluefin – this meeting seems to include items which may impact/benefit the albacore fishery.
5. June 4 – 5 – General Advisory Committee and the Scientific Advisory Subcommittee to the U.S. Section of the IATTC meetings – in La Jolla, Ca. Unknown at this time if any albacore related items will be on the Agenda.
6. June 18 - 25 - PFMC meeting in San Diego, Ca. There are typically HMS items on the June meeting. Don’t yet know if anything albacore related will be on this meeting’s Agenda.
7. Sept 2 – 6 – WCPFC Northern Committee meeting in Portland, Ore. Will update with Agenda items when they are available.
8. Sept 11 - 18 - PFMC meeting in Boise, Id. There are typically HMS items on the Sept meeting. Don’t yet know if anything albacore related will be on this meeting’s Agenda.
9. Nov 13 - 20 - PFMC meeting in Costa Mesa, Ca. There are typically HMS items on the November meeting. Don’t yet know if anything albacore related will be on this meeting’s Agenda.
10. Dec 5 – 11 – WCPFC Meeting in Port Moresby, PNG. Will update with Agenda items when they are available.
